## Introduction

There are approximately 16 million deaf and hearing-impaired individuals in the U.S., two million of whom are totally deaf. Of this number, many individuals had the advantage of hearing while they were young and have normal speech. The half million persons who are prelingually deaf are individuals who must live in an oral world without having had an opportunity to develop language, which is essential for communication.

There are many reasons why a person is born deaf or becomes deaf at a later time. German measles, meningitis and a high fever are a few of the most common reasons.
